



DAVID ELTON OUTDOOR FUND CRITERIA (DEOF)

To promote outdoor safety, the DEOF gives consideration to groups and individuals seeking funding in two areas:

- ***Development of courses and training in Risk Avoidance for organizations working with youth and outdoor leaders***

Although there are many excellent courses available in the areas of Outdoor Skills, the DEOF believes there is a lack of information and training available in Risk Awareness and Avoidance.

Therefore, the DEOF provides funding for the training of individuals and for the development of courses and programs promoting Risk Awareness and Risk Avoidance.

- ***Improved Stakeholder Communication of Risk Issues***

The DEOF believes that the communication of Risk Issues among stakeholders (youth participants, leaders, parents, educators and administrators) is often inadequate. Therefore the DEOF provides funding for activities, such as forums and workshops, which promote Risk Awareness through effective communication.
